what else did they gather or do to be fore?

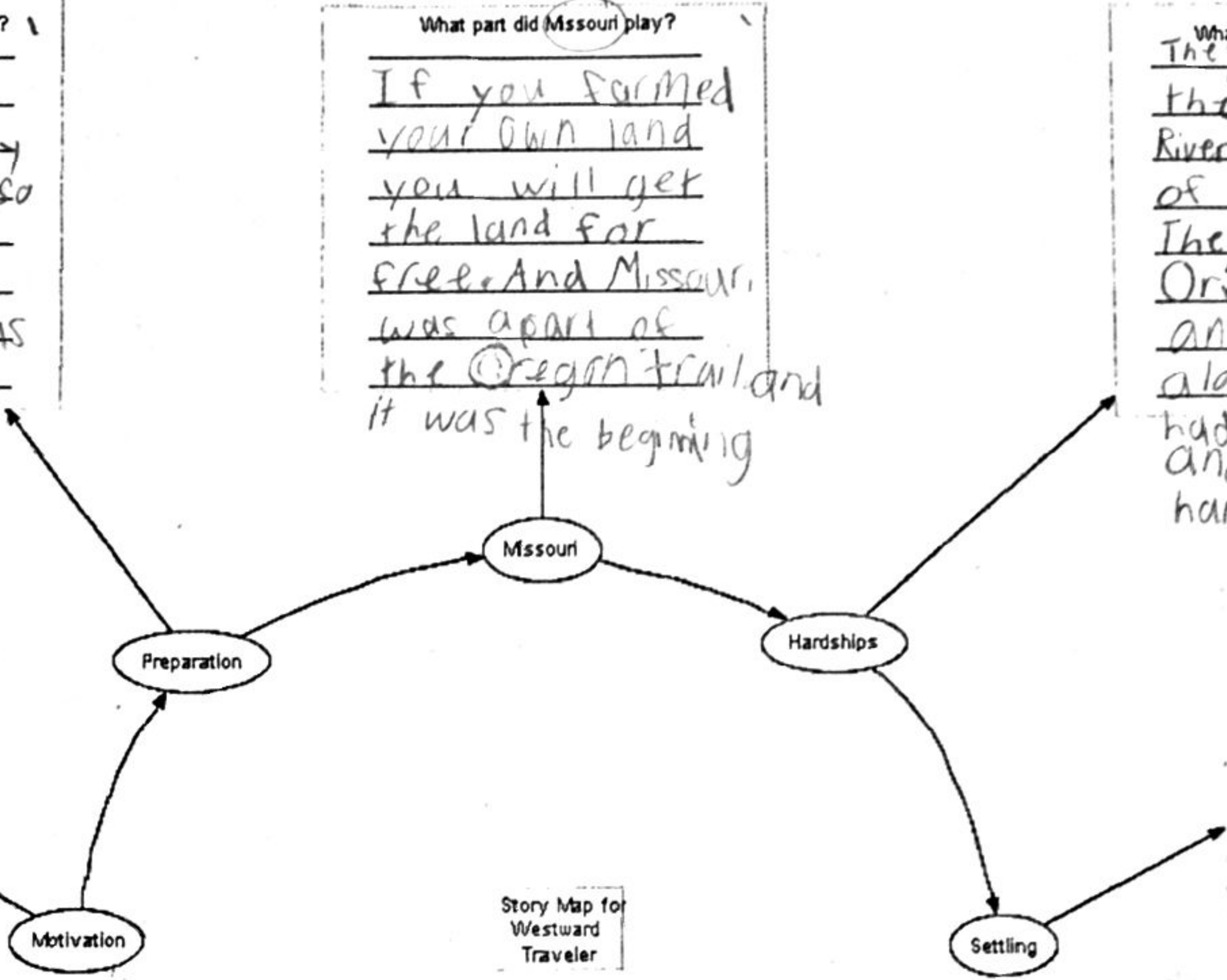
How did they prepare to go west?
